

Bubbles

Great for a child who:

Is learning to talk or sign
Is learning to use a communication device
Is learning to combine two or three words
Is learning to work on bilabial sounds /p, b, m/
Is learning language concept big/small

How to play:

Hold out bottle of unopened bubbles for your child to see. Model word or sign for "open" as your child exhibits interest in playing with the bubbles. Encourage your child to sign or say "bubbles" "more". Have fun popping the bubbles with your finger and say "POP" as you pop the bubbles.

Occasionally close the bubbles and set them aside. If your child appears to want more bubbles, **start the routine again targeting the same words: open, more, bubbles, pop, help.**

If your child is working on using **two or three word phrases**, target hte following: **open please**, more bubbles, pop bubbles, I want bubbles, all done, I blow, you blow, big bubble, little bubble.

If your child is learning to sign, remember Tell them, Show them, Help Them.
