

SIGNS FOR SENSORY IT COULD BE...

IF YOU ARE OBSERVING...

- Picky eating
- Not soothing easily
- Explosive reactions
- Difficulty making friends

• Fear of movement (especially backwards)

- Floppy or low muscle tone
- Constantly in motion

Sensory Processing

Vestibular Processing

- Difficulty dressing
- Doesn't play with toys
- Trips frequently
- Prefers to sit on the sidelines

Motor Planning

- Insists on only certain kinds of clothing
- Resisting hugs or cuddles
- Emotional reactions to being touched unexpectedly
- Avoids messy play

Tactile Sensitivity

- Limited awareness of personal space
- Difficulty with fine motor and/or handwriting skills
- Poor coordination
- Bumps into walls/furniture
- Uses too much force during play

Proprioceptive Processing

- Prolonged pacifer or thumb sucking
- Snoring or difficulty sleeping/feeling rested
- Excessive drooling
- Open bite
